Take advantage of our 300 campsites, two sandy beaches, forested hiking trails and vast open water which is ideal for swimming, windsurfing, sailing, boating and fishing.

### Alcohol/Cannabis

Alcohol is permitted only on registered campsites. Cannabis is permitted on campsites and in open spaces. Smoking of cannabis is not permitted near playgrounds or in the beach area. A total alcohol and cannabis ban is in effect on the Victoria Day and Labour Day weekends (Thursday at noon to Tuesday at noon).

### Fees and Reservation Policy

### Weather

Be aware of your surroundings and monitor the latest conditions for active weather. Seek appropriate shelter during severe weather during the day or night.

### Quiet Hours

11 p.m. to 7 a.m. No excessive noise at any time.

### Pets

Pets must be kept on a leash at all times and cannot be left unattended. No pets are permitted on the beach.

### Valuables

Ensure all valuables are locked in a safe place and out of sight.



Firewood & ice can be purchased at the gatehouse before 9 p.m.

### Camping

Guelph Lake offers nearly 300 serviced or unserviced campsites in a variety of locations, including riverfront and forest. Up to six people are permitted per campsite. Group campsites can be reserved for large groups. Check-in is after 2 p.m. and check-out is before noon.

### Kayaking

Kayaks can be rented at the boathouse by the main beach. Rentals are offered on weekends only from mid-June to Labour Day, weather permitting. There is an hourly rate, and a deposit is required.

### Swimming

Swimming in the two sandy beaches is a popular activity. There are no lifeguards, so parents and guardians must keep a close watch on children at all times. A lifejacket loaner program is available. Inquire at the gatehouse.

### Group Facilities

We welcome group events such as company picnics, family reunions and weddings at our three pavilions. The pavilions each offer an exceptional view of the lake. The largest of the three shelters seats about 500 people and has electricity. These facilities may be reserved at the gatehouse, or by calling the park.

Fish along the shoreline or from a boat for northern pike, smallmouth and largemouth bass, and more.

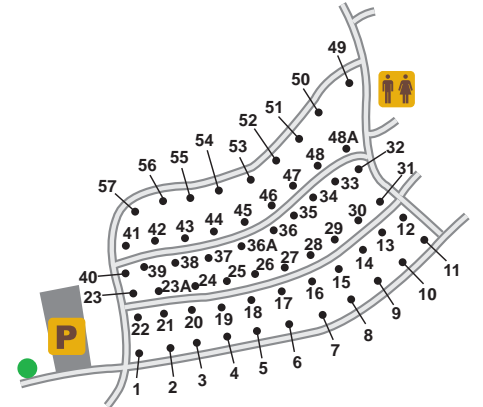

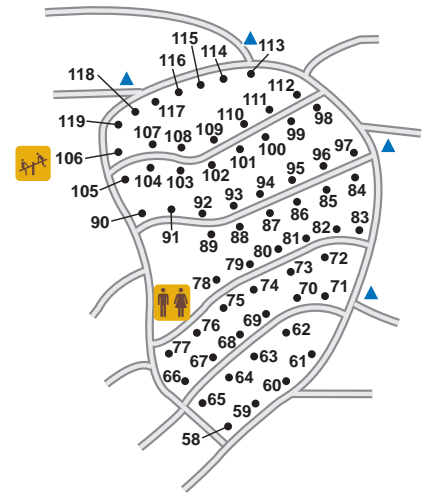

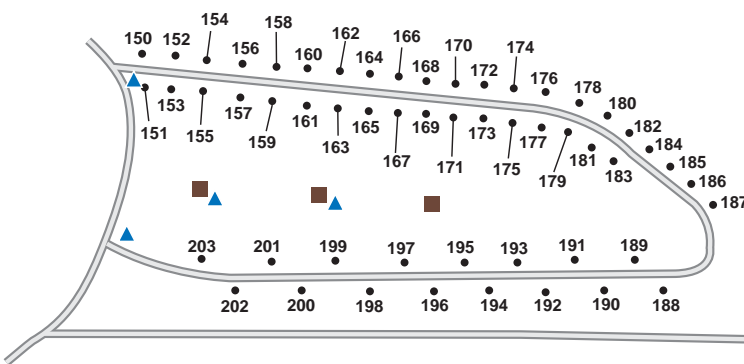

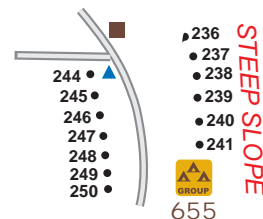

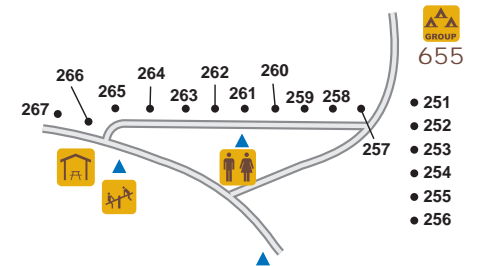

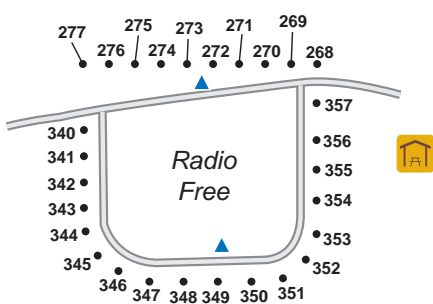

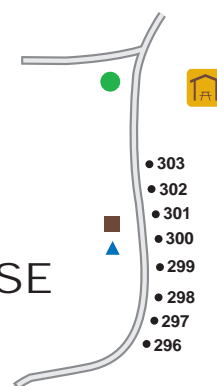
