Superintendent of Byng Island Conservation Area

The Grand River Conservation Authority (GRCA) has an international reputation for excellence in managing the natural resources of the largest inland river system in southern Ontario. Encompassing approximately 6,800 square km, the Grand River watershed has a population of almost one million people in 39 municipalities and two First Nations. Designated as a Canadian Heritage River, the Grand River and its major tributaries boast many outstanding human heritage features and excellent recreational opportunities. The GRCA is committed to environmental protection by delivering services that ensure the well-being of the environment and its inhabitants.

The **Grand River Conservation Authority** is seeking a strategically focused individual with exceptional leadership abilities for the role of **Superintendent III** at Byng Island Conservation Area.

We focus on teamwork, development, engagement and positive change. One of our key strategies is connecting people to the environment through outdoor experiences. Our staff teams are well-trained, and committed to servicing public needs. We maintain an innovative and positive work culture where knowledge is freely shared. Consider joining our committed team of staff and being part of an innovative, collaborative and rewarding workplace.

As the senior on-site Superintendent, reporting to the Manager of Conservation Areas, you will implement and manage an annual operating budget to deliver park programming and provide input to the 10 year capital forecast. You will also develop, implement and oversee annual operational and resource staffing plans to ensure efficiency, optimal customer service, security of assets and compliance with legislation and policy.

Our candidate of choice will be strategically oriented and possess strong leadership skills with a financial/business acumen (budgeting). You will have the ability to develop, implement and oversee operational plans and park management strategies. You will possess exceptional negotiation skills and the ability to communicate effectively with diverse interest groups (i.e. park visitors, Indigenous groups, other government agencies).

There is an expectation of the incumbent to exercise considerable independence of judgement and initiative, including providing expertise to other departments and stakeholders in the community. Demonstrate and hold others accountable for behaviours consistent with GRCA values and priorities.

The Superintendent III will be responsible for all aspects of the day-to-day operations of the Conservation Area. You will take a hands-on approach managing; the campgrounds (including daily and seasonal reservations), 1 ¼ acre swimming pool, sewage lagoon and waste water management, compliance with GRCA policies and regulations, facilitating events and administering agreements such as service contracts. Employee management is critical, utilizing human resource principles and practices, including supervision, providing performance evaluation and coaching. You will negotiate and establish local partnerships and sponsorships to promote programs and events to attract visitors and enhance revenues.

You will have extensive knowledge of various acts and regulations (i.e. Conservation Authorities Act and Regulations, Provincial Offences Act, the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Ontario Water Resources Act, the Employment Standards Act, the Occupiers Liability Act, the Trespass to Property Act, the Snowmobile and Off Road Vehicle Act and other related legislation) to ensure a safe work environment for staff and visitors.



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Outdoor work and the ability to work shifts, including evenings, weekends and provide on-call support is required.

Completion of a college diploma in a field related to parks and recreation, resource management, tourism or business administration or an equivalent post-secondary program is required. Minimum 10 years' of progressively responsible experience in outdoor recreation with at least six (6) years of supervisory experience preferably in a park or campground environment.
